

*The Pevensey single cylinder horizontal steam engine with the Stephenson's reverse linkage is typical of hundreds of steam engines that powered many of the smaller paddle steamboats used on the Australian inland river systems of Victoria and New South Wales. The model derives its name from the paddle steamer Pevensey that is still in operation today on the Murray River at Echuca in northern Victoria.*

*Without the Stephenson's reverse linkage it is a beautiful little horizontal mill engine typical of the many hundreds of steam engines used in factories and gold mines during the 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century. The model can be used to power a small pump, dynamo or other similar devices.*

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
